

Weekly Discipleship Plan (Week of May 10 – 16, 2026)

Catechism Question: (2/4)

Children's Catechism

Q. 33. What befell our first parents when they had sinned?

A. Instead of being holy and happy, they became sinful and miserable.

Q. 34. Did Adam act for himself alone in the covenant of works?

A. No; he represented all his posterity.

Shorter Catechism

Q42. What is the essence of the ten commandments?

A: The essence of the ten commandments is to love the Lord our God with all our heart, with all our soul, with all our strength, and with all our mind, and to love everyone else as we love ourselves.

Q43. What introduces the ten commandments?

A: These words introduce the ten commandments: "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery."

Scripture Memory: **1John 5:13** ¶ I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life. **5:14** And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will he hears us. **5:15** And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him.

DAILY DEVOTIONS

Day 1 (Sunday May 9)

Reading: II Chron 3-4

Questions:

- What new work did Solomon begin?
- Why do you think the passage gives such detail of the grandeur of Solomons Temple?

Prayer for: Col 1:18 – For Christ to have His place of pre-eminence in everything.

Day 2 - Monday

Reading: II Chron 5

Questions:

- How did Solomon bring the ark into the Temple? How did that differ from How David (and Uzzah) brought the ark to Jerusalem?
- What were the only things in the ark? What was their significance?
- What song did thou sing to the Lord? What does it mean?

Prayer for: Heb 13:21 – For God to equip us with all that is needed to do His will

Day 3 - Tuesday

Reading: II Chron 6

Questions:

- In 6: 3 – 4, how did Solomon bless all the people of Israel?
 - What promises had God fulfilled to Solomon?
 - In 6: 32-33, how did Solomon pray for foreigners that come to the Temple to pray? Why?
- Prayer for: Prov 3: 5 – 6 To acknowledge God in our thinking and actions, and that He provide us a good path.

Day 4 - Wednesday

Reading: II Chron 7-8

Questions:

- Discuss II Chron 7:14, as to what it meant for Israel, and for us (the Church) today?
- What are the 2 parts of God's promise to Solomon in 7: 17 – 20? What does this mean for us?
- Why did Solomon do all the things he did in 8: 12 – 15?

Prayer for: Matt 5:16 Help us let the light of Christ in us shine before men, God getting all the glory.

Day 5 - Thursday

Reading: II Chron 9

Questions:

- What was the Queen of Sheba's assessment of what she saw of Solomon and his kingdom?
- Who did she credit for these blessings in 9:8? Why did she say God had done all this?
- Let's do a little math – if a talent is 75 lbs, and there are 16 ounces in a pound, and an ounce of gold costs \$5,000, how much is the 666 talents of gold in the Temple worth? (9:13)
- How does II Chronicles 9 end?

Prayer for: The Great Commission to be fulfilled

Day 6 - Friday

Reading: II Chron 10-12

Questions:

- Who are Jeroboam and Rehoboam?
- What does II Chron 10: 15 say about Ahijah's prophecy in I Kings 11: 29 -33? How does this explain II Chron 10:19?
- Who – and what kingdom - does the rest of Ch. 10-12 focus on?

Prayer for: Matt 6 – For God to remind us to forgive others, and that He forgive us

Day 7 - Saturday

Reading: II Chron 13-14

Questions:

- Who is the next named king in Judah? With whom does he go to war? Who wins / loses the battle? How does this tie back to I Kings 11: 29 – 33?
- Why did Abijah and the men of Judah defeat Jeroboam and Israel? (II Chron 13:18)
- Who is the next king in Judah, and how does Ch. 14 describe him?

Prayer for: Eph 6: 6 – that we do obey all God's will from our hearts, and not for man's praise.
